The PaM Community, established in 2018, aims to change that, by:

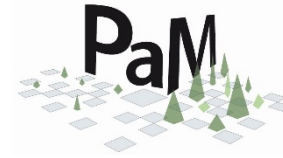
- **Promoting Palaeolithic and Mesolithic archaeology** within the EAA
